*Results of nurse focus group findings to be presented at the
17th Annual Summer Institute of Nursing Informatics at the University of Maryland.*

ORLANDO, FL (June 15, 2007) — ICU Data Systems, a provider of critical care medical technology solutions, announced today that the results of recent nurse focus group findings on the *iCuro*TM (ICU Real-time Observer) 3.0 Nurse Assessment Module will be presented as a poster at the 17th Annual Summer Institute of Nursing Informatics at the University of Maryland, July 18 – 21, 2007.

Designed by a team of nationally renowned physicians and computer scientists at ICU Data Systems, *iCuro*TM 3.0 serves as a bedside patient data management system which includes a complete self charting flow sheet, meeting the real-time needs of fast moving, hands on critical caregivers. The focus group, consisting of highly experienced Intensive Care Unit (ICU) nurses from diverse ICU backgrounds, tested the Nursing Assessment Module, which allows nurses to enter care notes by using simplified touchscreens, automatically formulating full structured nursing notes and sentences with a keystroke. This feature received top rankings and extremely positive feedback from focus group participants. The ICU nurses were impressed by *iCuro*TM3.0's ability to replace all components of the traditional ICU Paper Flow Sheet, which many nurses use today to manually track patient data. The speed of charting and compatibility of the system within myriad care venues also received high marks. In addition, the capabilities of self charting, automated fluid calculation, an intuitive touchscreen interface and better data presentation were also noted as a great improvements over current ICU processes, yielding enormous time savings and error reductions.

Focus group leader, Willa Drummond MD, MS (Informatics), Founder and Chief Medical Information Executive for ICU Data Systems, commented, "The need for *iCuro*TM 3.0 is critical, as clinical nurse staffing shortages are severe and ongoing. Nurses were impressed by the time-saving ability to rapidly chart a complete nursing assessment at the bedside, allowing them to be up-to-date on charting before leaving the patient's room, with no typing required. The accessibility of having all vital patient information in one place was of top importance, including the ability to have the entire patient history at their fingertips, and to electronically chart vital signs and ventilator settings at user-chosen intervals."

Charting errors are greatly decreased, allowing overall improved database aided decision making by caregivers. Not only does *iCuro*TM3.0 benefit the care of patients, but the economic performance of hospitals as well.”
